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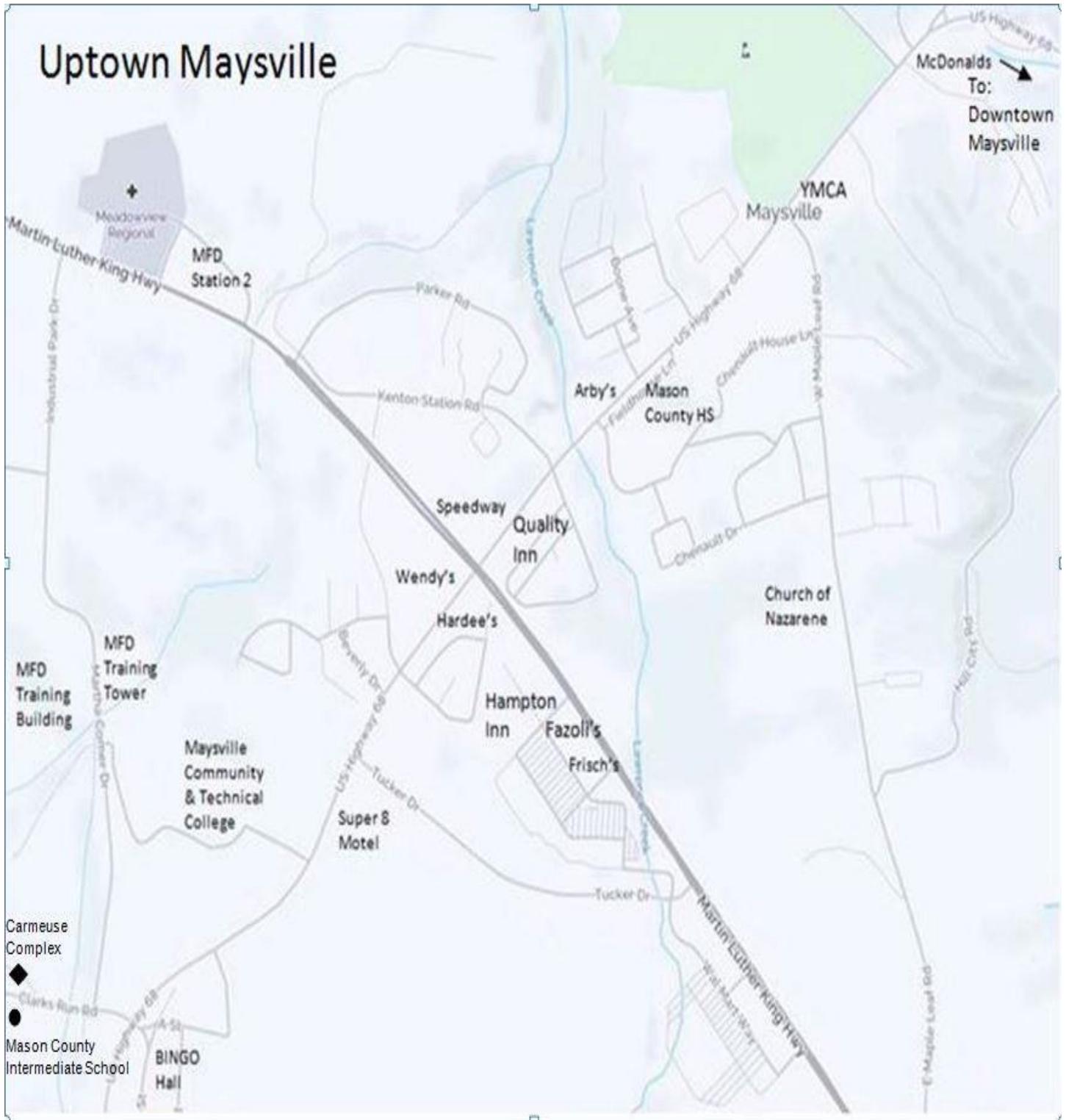
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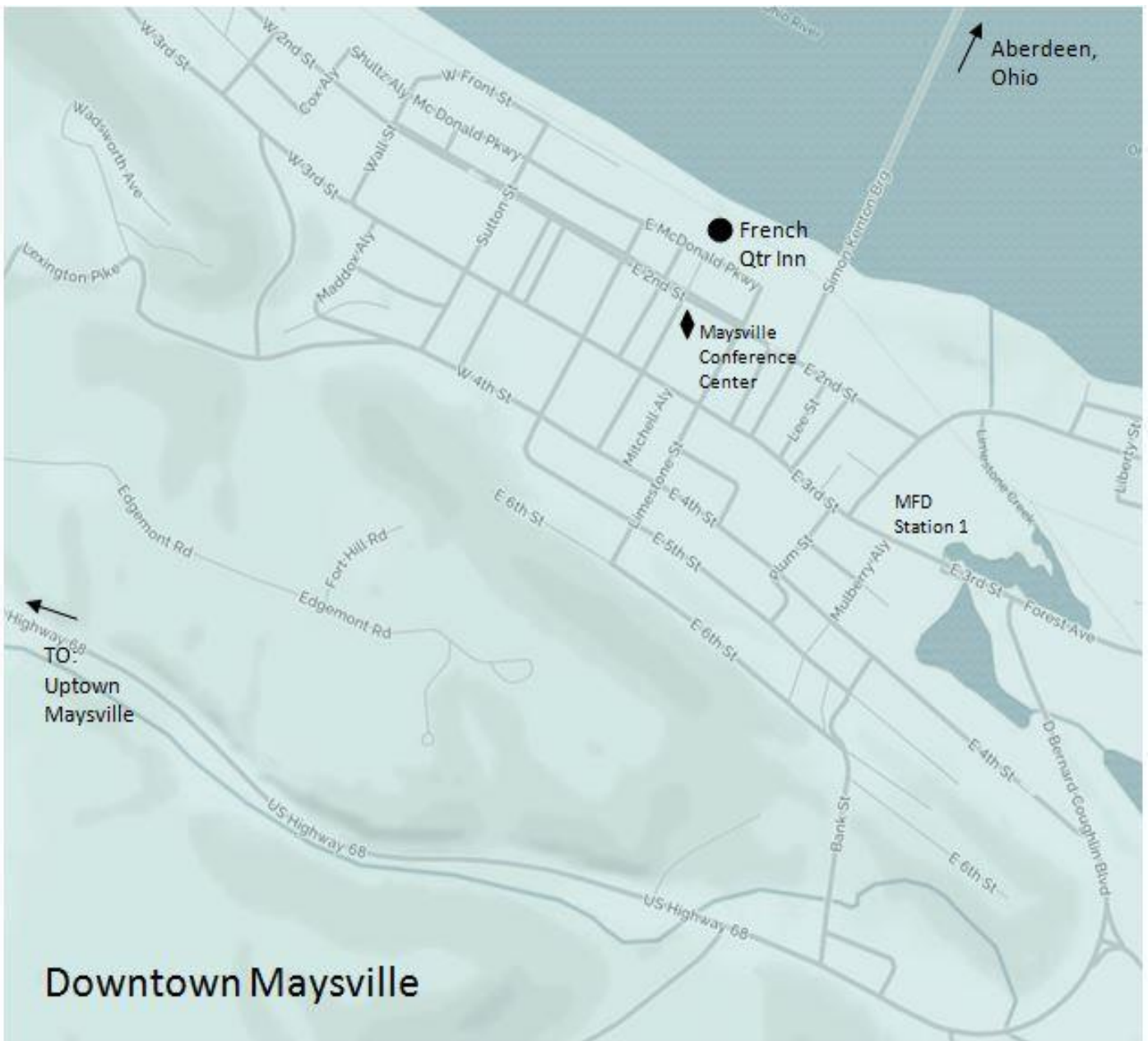

Retired Fire Chief Rick Lasky

Retired Fire Chief Rick Lasky is a 36-year veteran of the fire service, who served as chief of the Lewisville (TX) Fire Department for 12 years, prior to that he was the Fire Chief in Coeur d'Alene Idaho. Rick followed in his father's footsteps beginning his career as a firefighter in the suburbs on the southwest side of Chicago and while in Illinois received the 1996 International Society of Fire Service Instructors award "Innovator of the Year" for his part in developing the "*Saving Our Own*" program.

Throughout his 30-plus years in the fire service he has served as a career and volunteer firefighter. He served as the co-lead

instructor for the H.O.T. Firefighter Survival program at FDIC for over 10 years. He is a long-standing editorial advisory board member for *Fire Engineering Magazine*, and also serves on the *FDIC* advisory board. Rick is the author of the best-selling books "*Pride and Ownership-A Firefighter's Love of the Job*" and "*Five Alarm Leadership: From the Firehouse to the Fireground*" published by *PennWell Books* and is the co-host for the radio show "The Command Post" heard on *Fire Engineering Talk Radio*.

CLASSES SCHEDULED TO BE OFFERED

Class # 1 – EMT Continuing Education- Friday, Saturday, and Sunday

This class will provide an EMT with the required hours for recertification. ***This class will start on Friday afternoon at 1:00pm.*** (Friday class will be 8 hours of electives, Saturday and Sunday will be 16 hours of the Kentucky Core Content requirements for recertification).

Instructors: *Air - Evac Flight Team*

Class # 2 – Basic Fire Fighting – Friday, Saturday, and Sunday

This class is for the new firefighters or seasoned veterans wanting to “brush up” on their skills. Students will be given some basic fire fighting knowledge and practicing skills necessary to begin a long and safe life of fire suppression. ***NOTE: This class will start on Friday at 6:00pm.*** **Protective clothing will be required all three days and shall consist of NFPA APPROVED coat, pants, boots, hood, helmet, gloves, SCBA and spare bottle.**

Instructors: *Maysville Fire Department*

Class # 3 – Hard To Get Hours – Saturday and Sunday (each topic 3 hrs)

Have you found yourself needing a few training hours that are next to impossible to find? This newly structured course will suit your needs by gaining you 12 of the hard to get fire service training hours in the state. Students will be able to choose one of two classes offered in the morning and afternoon each day. Three hour classes will be offered and students are required to attend the entire class.

Class # 4 –Grain Rescue - Saturday and Sunday (14-16 hrs)

The scope of this course is to educate students about grain storage facility types, their construction, and operating features. OSHA regulations, physical-environmental hazards and potential rescue resources are identified. Scene management and safety are discussed in conjunction with locating and making contact with the victim. Appropriate non-entry rescue efforts are identified. Various cutting tools are used in a simulated rescue to assist in the removal of grain from the system. Upon completion of this class the student will possess the ability to function as a member to a rescue team conducting rescue operations at a grain storage facility.

Class # 5 – Firefighter Survival & Rescue – Saturday and Sunday (14-16 hrs)

Firefighter Survival: This course will emphasize the removal of trapped or unconscious firefighters from a burning building and self rescue techniques when the primary escape route is blocked. This is a required course for all new firefighters in Kentucky. **FULL NFPA APPROVED TURNOUT GEAR AND SCBA ARE REQUIRED.** (Saturday)

Firefighter Rescue: This course is designed to teach you how to rescue fellow firefighters from a burning structure. Special techniques are used for the rescue portion of the 2-part series. This is a required course for all new firefighters in Kentucky. The completion of FF survival is a prerequisite for this Course. **FULL NFPA APPROVED TURNOUT GEAR AND SCBA ARE REQUIRED.** (Sunday)

Class # 6 – Hazmat Operations – Saturday and Sunday (14-16 hrs)

This 16-hour training program addresses OSHA-required information for safe and effective response to hazardous chemical emergencies. Lectures, slide shows and individual and group activities are designed to help the student attain competency at OSHA's "first responder operations" level for chemical emergency response. Hands-on sessions will acquaint students with the use of various hazardous materials responder guide books. The course is one of a series recommended by the Kentucky Emergency Response Commission for interagency, standardized response to chemical emergencies. This course is open to all public sector employees and volunteers whose jobs may require response to hazardous materials emergencies. Private sector personnel may also participate in the training if they are part of a governmental hazardous materials response team.

Class # 7 – Flashover Awareness – Friday Night (3 hrs)

This 3-hour class is designed to deliver the minimum requirement for the 150 hour certification. During this class, the student will learn the indicators, both internal and external, of an impending flashover or backdraft situation and tactics to reduce the risks. This class will be lecture only. **No live burn will be held and NO PPE will be required. Classroom Lecture Only.**

Class # 8 - Kentucky Wildland Awareness - Friday Night (3 hrs)

This is the Fire Commission mandated wildland awareness class (formerly M-0300; with portions of the S-130/Basic Wildland Firefighting and S-190/Wildland Fire Behavior courses being covered plus topics that are Kentucky specific). The state Fire Commission adopted this course for basic wildland firefighting knowledge and is **MANDATORY** for all new firefighters. This is a 3-hour lecture class.

Class # 9 - Auto Extrication - Friday Night (3-4 hrs)

This class gives the rescuer hands on experience in extrication of a patient using The Jaws of Life. New up-to-date techniques for safer and rapid extrication will be discussed and practiced. This *IS NOT* part of the EMT continued education class.

Full turnout gear required. No SCBA needed.

Instructors: *Maysville Fire Department and Vogelpohl Rescue Equipment.*

Class # 10 - Hazmat Ice Cream - Friday Night (2-3 hrs)

Cryogenic Liquids – This class will consider hazards that are presented by materials such as Liquid Nitrogen and Liquid Oxygen, including the limitations of your equipment when dealing with them. This will go beyond what you learn from the Hazardous Materials ERG. At the conclusion, attendees will have a “tasteful” understanding of HazMat ice cream.

Class # 11 - Introduction to Emergency Management for First Responders - Friday Night (3-4 hrs)

The goal of this course is to acquaint 1st responders with the concepts of emergency management, including history and underlying principles of emergency management, key areas of emphasis, and the emergency responder’s roles and responsibilities. Students will receive hours in “Emergency and Disaster Planning”

Instructor: *Bobby Carpenter, KYEM Area 7*

Class # 12 - The Silent MAYDAY for the Fire that Burns Within - Friday Night (3-4 hrs)

This class will discuss suicide prevention, awareness training and intervention techniques for use among First Responder personnel and their families. You will come away with the ability to understand the stress, pressure, and culture in fire service that can lead to suicidal ideation. Develop strategies to train fire service personnel in suicide prevention. Recognize the importance of establishing department policy and procedures related to suicide prevention and postvention. Convey the importance of all of the above when providing future fire service suicide prevention training. Identify suicidal behaviors and communication. Understand, Identify, Prevent, & Limit effects of PTSD. Significant others encouraged to attend.

Class # 13 - Flashover Recognition & Survival (Live-Burn) - Sunday (8 hrs)

This course will provide information on flashover recognition and ways to survive. This course is designed to provide the fire service with a safe and secure method of flashover training. Firefighters are taught to recognize the signs of an impending flashover, provide techniques for possibly escaping an impending flashover, with the goal of saving firefighters from injury and death. The first three hours of the course will be the required lecture portion. The remaining portion of the course will involve hands – on Live Fire training using the Flashover Trailer.

Class #14 – **Pride and Ownership: The Love for the Job** – *Saturday (8 hrs)*

Ignite Your Love for the Job

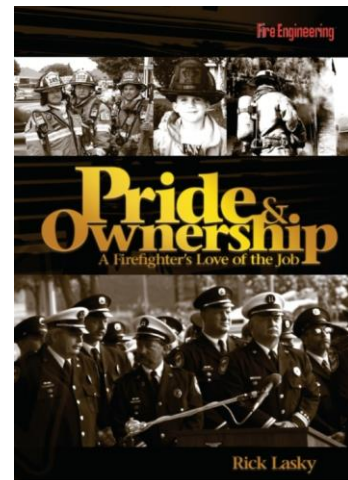

Class #15 – **Bobtail Propane** – *Saturday (8 hrs)*

This is a LIVE-FIRE, HANDS – ON course that will help the firefighter make informed decisions concerning propane emergencies. The Bobtail Propane training prop will be used for live fire scenarios.

Class # 16 – **Building Strong Leadership** – *Sunday (8 hrs)*

This will be an informal sit down for all Chief Officers **AND** up and coming individuals interested in the current events of the Fire Commission. A variety of topics will be covered during this course.

Class # 17 – **American Heart Association-BLS and AED for the Healthcare Professional** - *Friday Night (3-4 hrs)*

This BLS Course trains participants to promptly recognize several life-threatening emergencies, give high-quality chest compressions, deliver appropriate ventilations and provide early use of an AED.

Students also complete a written exam.

Class Cost: \$7.50 per students wanting 2 year CPR/AED certification card issued

Class is free for students only wanting to receive SFRT Training hours

This course satisfies the 3 hours of required CPR/AED Training for FF certification with the KY Fire Commission

NFPA 1403 requires "student prerequisites" to permit participation in live fire training evolutions.
