THE LINE OFFICER, WHO, ME?

FOR FIREFIGHTERS, LINE OFFICERS, & CHIEF OFFICERS – VOLUNTEER AND CAREER PAID. For the firefighter who becomes a line officer for a day or a career, this course is designed to:

- Understand your skills and strengths.
- Know the rules of being a line officer.
- Discuss the culture you have to operate within.
- When are you the solution and not part of the problem?
- Understand that it is all about challenge.
- What is an ethical dilemma?
- Why me? Why not me?
- Fire duty for the line officer!

The full course will involve extensive individual and group interactive exercises. Discussion, challenges, and scenarios will be used to help learn and understand the importance of your role in leadership as a line officer.



INSTRUCTOR BIO - Rick Kolomay is a 37-year veteran of the fire service. He has served with both combination volunteer, combination career/POC/Private, and career fire departments assigned to engine, truck, ambulance, and squad companies. He rose through the ranks from firefighter /EMT, firefighter/paramedic, lieutenant, captain, acting battalion chief, deputy chief, and fire chief. He was also a full time instructor for the *Illinois Fire Service Institute* (IFSI), an IFSI Field Instructor for 33 years, Instructor for the *Illinois Fire Chiefs Association*, Instructor for the *Romeoville (IL) [regional] Fire Academy*, *Northeastern Illinois Public Safety Training Academy* (NIPSTA), and an instructor and consultant with *Fire Training Resources, Inc.* Rick has instructed throughout the United States teaching firefighter rescue techniques and line officer training. In 2003 Rick co-authored a best-selling Fire Engineering book, ***Firefighter Rescue & Survival***.

'HANDS-ON' ACTUAL TRUCK OVERHAUL & VENT OPERATIONS

This class is a primer on Truck Company Operations. It will cover numerous aspects of structural firefighting other than “putting the wet stuff on the red stuff”. Topics to be covered will include: scene size up, building evaluation, forcible entry, rescue, overhaul, and ventilation. This is a “hands-on” class, so students will need to bring full structural PPE not including SCBA. N95 respiratory masks will be provided. Class is limited to 30 students daily d
